Welcome to York High School

Working together... **Better education**

As we move into summer, we are delighted to officially welcome York High School into the South Bank Trust.

The school converted to academy status on 1st May 2018 and joins us as a sponsored academy, with South Bank leader Trevor Burton taking on the role of Executive Headteacher across York High and Millthorpe Schools.

Mr Burton is ably supported by Head of School Rod Sims. Staff from York High have been working closely with the South Bank Trust since September 2017, prior to their conversion.

The school has embarked on an improvement journey that will be completed over the next few years and is designed to bring improvements for all of the students at the school.

The journey will of course be a two-way process, with benefits for both secondary schools in this new partnership arrangement. Teachers will be able to take part in the Learning Networks for senior leaders and SEND straight away and we look forward to embarking on further partnership work between the staff of the two secondary schools from the start of the new academic year in

Additional funding

Working together... **Better finances**

The national picture for school funding is currently a very depressing one - staffing costs are rising rapidly as a result of national pay awards and changes to employer contributions for National Insurance and Pensions. School income remains unchanged, however, leading to significant challenges for all schools.

Although the Trust cannot alter this overall position, as academies, we have been able to bid for additional funding to support

specific projects.

We are pleased to announce that we have received the funds for four separate projects: three for our schools and one for the MAT itself.

Three of our schools put in successful bids to the Capital Investment Fund (CIF) for a range of building works and this has brought just over £2 million of additional funding into the Trust:

Woodthorpe has received

£700,000 to fund re-roofing work; Knavesmire has received £370,000 for re-roofing and window replacement work; and Millthorpe has received £998,000 for re-roofing work.

The Trust itself was also successful in making a bid. We have received £26,000 to pay for a Central Business Manager for the next academic year. This role will include a focus on procurement work, seeking to make further cost savings on contracts, goods and services,

The event concluded with a song learnt by all the children at both schools and directed by Ms Woolgar. The quality of the singing was impressive and the obvious pleasure that the children gained from joining their voices together was uplifting to watch and to hear.

Award for Scarcroft School

Working together... **Celebrating successes**

York Youth Council has awarded Scarcroft Primary School the first ever 'Minding Minds Award' in recognition of the school's commitment to improving pupils' mental health and wellbeing.

The Minding Minds Award has been created by York Youth Council to support and recognise schools which actively work to improve their students' mental health and wellbeing. Schools are asked to work with pupils to identify areas which could have a positive impact and develop plans to bring about those improvements.

Pupils and Teachers at Scarcroft School decided to put in an application for a Bronze Award, working with the school's Inclusion Leader Carole Dickson, supported by the Council's Wellbeing Worker Louise Wall. The areas the pupils identified were the school's *friendship bench* (by analysing its impact); *friendship skills* (including looking at setting up a skills group to help others build friendships); and looking into establishing a *quiet area* of the playground.

The project is being led by the pupils in the School Council, who are very proud to have been the first school to have received this award.

A new Headteacher for Scarcroft

Scarcroft Primary School's Headteacher, Anna Cornhill, is retiring this summer after 32 years in education and 18 years at Scarcroft as Head.

Governors at Scarcroft, supported by colleagues from within the Trust, carried out interviews for the post of Headteacher in May.

They have appointed Paul Edwards (no relation to Jo Edwards—see right!) as the new Headteacher and he will take up his new post on 1st September 2018.

Paul is currently Headteacher at Fangfoss C of E Primary School in the East Riding of Yorkshire and until recently, has also been a Trustee at South Bank MAT. He has now stepped down from his role on the Board, to ensure that there is no conflict of interest.
